Varieties of Forgetfulness***A conversation with one of our highest-ranking women doctors***

As a neurologist, Dr. Helena Chui studies disorders of the brain, including the effects of aging and disease on memory, logic, and reason. There are many kinds of forgetfulness, ranging from absentmindedness to stress to Alzheimer disease. Is there a way to tell them apart? Are there ways to improve memory and retention?

Dr. Chui will describe the 3 R's of memory (registration, recording, and retrieval) and some of the common conditions that can weaken or strengthen them. Additionally, given Dr. Chui's distinguished career, she can touch on: providing quality care to patients and families, leadership, and team building for success.

Dr. Helena Chui is the principal investigator for the NIA-funded USC Alzheimer's Disease Research Center (www.usc.edu/memory) and a multi-institutional program project on vascular cognitive impairment. Dr. Chui is the author of over 145 publications, 30 book chapters, and has served on the editorial board for Stroke, Alzheimer Disease and Associated Disorders, and Archives of Neurology.
