The Rev. Jim Burklo has been a university minister, church pastor, community organizer and writer. For eight years, he served as the ecumenical Protestant minister for the United Campus Christian Ministry at Stanford University. He also served as vice-chair of the Community Working Group-Opportunity Center, which built a \$24 million housing complex for Palo Alto's homeless residents. Rev. Burklo previously served as executive director of the Urban Ministry of Palo Alto, associate director of the Ecumenical Hunger Program, and pastor of Sausalito Presbyterian Church.

For 18 years Nancy DeNero led strategic planning and marketing for Fortune 500 corporations in the Los Angeles basin. She founded the Organization of Women Executives in 1975 and served twice as president. Upon moving to Minneapolis in 1992, she led YWCA's "Spirituality in the Workplace" three-day event and served on the board of the Ripley Foundation, providing grants for services to disadvantaged girls. Since completing seminary in 2004, she has served on the boards of Progressive Christians Uniting, Lumunos (Formerly Faith at Work) and the Coalition of Ministry in Daily Life.

Together, Burklo and DeNero will discuss spirituality in the workplace, spiritual resources for USC staff, and accommodating differences: making room for people of faith, nonbelievers, those with religious practices and those with spiritual practices.

The mission of the Office of Religious Life at USC is to foster a vibrant university community that encourages the pursuit of meaning through spiritual reflection and free inquiry, provides fair opportunities to participate in religious life, advances mutual understanding and respect among differing traditions - and in all these ways, strengthens us to actively engage in building a just and peaceful world.
