This workshop is designed to inspire beginning and novice users, while sparking new notions for creative approaches for those who use the software regularly. Transforming PowerPoint slides so that they fully support you and your presentation begins with how you prepare -- and perhaps most importantly -- how you think about the content and intention of your talk. This workshop will focus on these preliminary ideas, offering helpful guidelines while posing challenging questions about how we typically work with presentation software. No previous experience is required.

With an extensive background in film production and project management, Stacy Patterson joined the University of Southern California in 2004, where she serves as program manager for the USC Institute for Multimedia Literacy. She is also a student in the Master of Leadership program in the USC School of Policy, Planning and Development and is co-chair for the Women in Management Professional Development Committee.

Stacy graduated from the University of New Mexico with a BA in Fine Arts (emphasis in Theatre).
