Louise Ball, now retired USC staff, served as a WIM President in 1981-1982. Ms. Ball was the Administrative Director of the School of Medicine through four USC Deans, and was a founding member of the University Staff Club. Ball continues to be very active in the Emeriti Center, serving as Chair of the Center's USC Living History Project, and is currently Vice President of the Staff Retirement Association.

Dr. Mary Campbell is Assistant Vice President in the Career Services Division at the University of Southern California, overseeing the university's talent management functions: Recruitment Services and the office of Professional and Organizational Development. In addition, she currently serves as Chairman of the Board for the California Diversity Council. At USC since 2000, Campbell is also a regular presenter at national and local industry-related conferences and association events.

Emily Laskin is Senior Associate Dean, External Relations for the USC Marshall School of Business. She joined USC in 2009 and is charged with all elements of fundraising for Marshall, as well as Alumni and Corporate Relations. Prior to her arrival at Marshall, Laskin held a number of development positions in the arts, including Director of Development for the Sundance Institute, and Vice President of Development for the Los Angeles Philharmonic and Hollywood Bowl, where she had a leading role in the capital campaign to build Walt Disney Concert Hall. Laskin holds an MFA in Music and is a singer and voice teacher.

Carolyn Heine, WIM President Emerita, will serve as moderator for this dynamic panel. Heine is currently Assistant Registrar in the Office of Academic Records and Registrar. Her USC career began in 1952, where her positions have included Administrative Director of the Law School, Operations Director of the Davidson Conference Center, and the initiating Director of Evening College Recruitment and Services. She is a founding member of the Staff Club, was advisor to WIM in its inception, and WIM President from 2000 to 2002. In 1967, then California Governor Ronald Reagan appointed her Executive Director of the State Commission on the Status of Women, leaving USC from 1967 to 1974 to head that body, leading to the successful outlawing of sex discrimination in employment in California.
